Paula Riganti (Argentina)

Is a family Physician in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Holds a master's in medical education from Cardiff University.

She is part of the research group on Shared Decision Making of the Italian Hospital of Buenos Aires.

Germán Málaga (Peru)

Is a Senior Professor at the Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia, Lima, Peru and an internist with more than 25 years of experience. His research interests are chronic diseases, research implementation and the search for inclusive and democratic health systems.

An important part of his work has been to promote the participation of patients in health care, thus improving adherence to treatment and seeking to reform the health system from the community level.

Paulina Bravo (Chile)

Is an Associate Professor at the School of Nursing of the Pontificia Universidad Católica

lica de Chile. Her background is in mental health nursing and completed her post-doctoral training at the School of Social Sciences and Medicine at Cardiff University.
